
### **Dramatics Club**



### National Alumni Association

On June 15, 1921, the graduates of the Classes of '19, '20, and '21, of what was then the Anderson Bible Training School, met to organize an Alumni Association. In 1938 the Association was reorganized with broadened objectives.

To these, to our own Christian faculty, and to many others, the students at Anderson College owe their rich Christian environment.




He persevered in the face of disheartening bad luck—giving of his time and energy to help create a real ball team.

Although he was little known around the campus, he was well liked by all those who had the opportunity of meeting him.


