This issue of Centering On Ministry could very well be one of the most important bits of information you will receive this Fall. It is an attempt to provide ministers with a twelve-month calendar of continuing education opportunities.

Fall 1983

The Center for Pastoral Studies contacted a broad spectrum of agencies, schools, regional assemblies, etc. asking for information about ministerial training opportunities. The response has generally been good.

As you look over the calendar of events, you will discover a variety of opportunities for your personal growth and development as a minister. It is important that you choose carefully the events in which you plan to participate this year. Choosing carefully and early will enable you to make the necessary time and budget commitment to assure participation.

When choosing events, you will want to keep in mind how you most enjoy learning. That is, you need to ask yourself, "Which learning methods do I most enjoy?" Here is a sample of various methods that will be used in the events schedules: lecture, discussion, home reading, media resources, workshop or clinic approach, observation or travel, colleague clusters, and self-directed research.

You may also make your choice from a wide variety of settings such as: home, minister's study, public facilities, church settings, local institutions (hospitals, prisons, etc.), universities, seminaries, church agencies, and conference centers.

It is also important that your selection be made in accordance with your personal growth needs. Select areas where you need to further your skills. Resist the temptation to do the simple, familiar thing. Stretch yourself a bit. Get involved in a new area of ministerial education, Develop some new skills.

Well, you are off into an exciting journey of continuing education. These are excellent opportunities for personal enrichment. Choose wisely. Plan carefully. May God grant you an exciting twelve months of personal growth and spiritual enrichment.

YOUR MINISTRY AND VITAL CHRISTIANITY

One sunny Sunday morning in March, Mary visited a Church of God. On the way out an usher handed her a copy of the March 13 Vital Christianity.

Mary read Laura Withrow's article where she described her attempts at learning to ski. Mary said to herself, "Well, I've never skied but I sure would like to meet Laura Withrow." She read humorous articles by Jim Sparks and John Little and really got interested in the magazine.

Mary, who is single herself, was delighted to see Bill White's column for singles, a column dealing with relationships with a former spouse. This was particularly helpful to Mary who is a recent divorcee, still working through her own grief and loneliness.

Mary went through the magazine line by line. Not everything met her immediate need but the well written editorials and articles made sense to her. When she got to the Bible study on Ephesians she decided that maybe she should be involved in daily Bible study.

Wednesday morning the pastor called her at work and set up an appointment to visit her that afternoon. The topics of their discussion centered comfortably around Mary's reading of the Vital Christianity. It was a good place for Mary to start to get to know the Church of God.

Vital Christianity supports the local pastor's ministry. It holds a high view of the pastor's role.

Vital Christianity's main concern is to inspire and nurture Christians as they grow to be more like Christ. In the column "Diets for Growing Pastors" thoughtful and experienced writers explore the tasks of the pastor and the issues that face the pastor and the pastor's family.

Vital Christianity belongs to the Church of God. The editor's only desire is that the magazine support the ministry of the local church and pastor. That is its reason for existence.

David Augsburger is Associate Professor of Pastoral Care and Counseling at the Associated Mennonite Biblical Seminaries, Elkhart, Indiana. An ordained minister of the Mennonite Church, he is a graduate of Eastern Mennonite College and Seminary, and received a Ph.D. from the School of Theology at Claremont, California.

Dr. Augsburger has authored fifteen books, the most recent of which are Caring Enough To Hear And Be Heard; Caring Enough To Forgive; Anger, Assertiveness and Pastoral Care; The Love Fight: Caring Enough To Confront.

He is an excellent communicator and has served for eight years as a radio spokesman for the Mennonite churches and has been the recipient of numerous awards.

Dr. Augsburger will be the keynote speaker and conduct conferences on conflict in our personal lives on Tuesday, October 18.

Alvin Lewis is the Associate Secretary of the Board of Christian Education of the Church of God, Anderson, Indiana. He has responsibilities in adult education, family life, marriage enrichment and leadership development. He pastored for twelve years and taught college for six years. He has had extensive experience and training in adult and family life education.

Dr. Lewis recieved a Ph.D. in adult education and family life education from Kansas State University.
